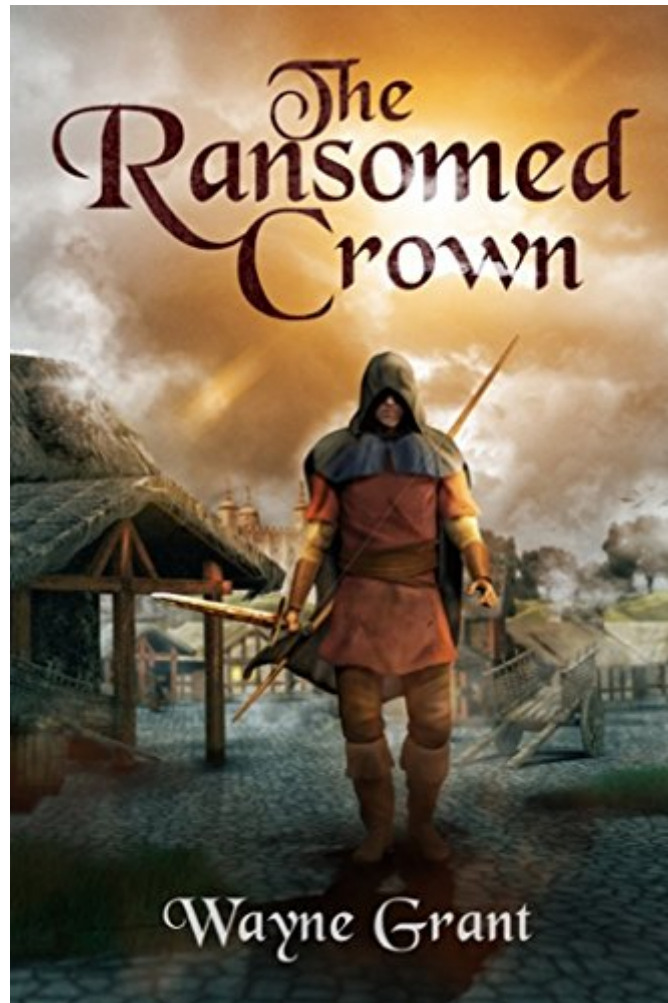

So I 99% loved the book. I did NOT like the "loose end," but it fits and leaves some things open for a sequel... That said, there's lots of adventure and unexpected twists in the plot. My children thought there was a little too much talking and set up, but this didn't bother me. We've read and re-read the other books and had fun discussing what would happen in this book. I loved Robin and Tuck's story and how it worked into the historical context. Mr. Grant has tweaked the historical timeline somewhat, but I feel he has portrayed the historical characters well. Just don't expect a lot of flattery for Richard! This is a great portrayal of this time period as a civil war and the destruction that was

being wrought in England. A note to parents: all these books have some swearing in them, not heavy, but there. I edit it out when I read it to the children. The author doesn't dwell on the violence but it is a time of war and killing and there are bloody battles portrayed. Thank you Mr. Grant, and I will look forward to reading your future books!

What to say? Somehow the Saga of Roland Inness grabbed me and would not let go. This series is not the best written in form, it has many mistakes and many flaws, and yet, I love it. I think I love it because the author loves it. I can feel his excitement, his heart, and his imagination shining through the story and the characters. Grant is a real person who loves Roland Inness, and by turn, made me love him. Roland is not the most witty, charming, nor handsome hero to ever grace a series. But he is brave, sincere, straightforward, and smart. He never gives up. He felt like a more realistic version of medieval heroes and legends such as Robin Hood. Roland is a hero you come to believe might have actually lived. I do wish Roland had been able to have more of the spotlight in this book. So many events and characters had to be brought to a conclusion in this story, still, I wish Roland had a bit more "screen time". Especially when it came to shared moments with Millicent. Call me and old romantic, but I deeply enjoyed their relationship. I am waiting with bated breath in hopes of this story being continued. Grant has given hints that he is not entirely done with Roland Inness. That makes me very happy as I am not fully done with Roland Inness either. There is more of his story to be told and I cannot wait to hear it.

I have so enjoyed these stories. In reading the books in this series I've come to know the characters personally and wholly admit I'll miss them. Such a beautiful blend of fact and fiction and so well written. I look forward to catching up with Roland again sometime, hopefully, in the near future.
