After Incandescent, I was on the fence but I knew I'd pick up Affliction especially since I really liked the setup for Holly and Sy, which was left very vague but mysterious in the first book. So the first quarter overlaps with the last several chapters of Incandescent and we find out what was really happening with Holly and Sy and boy, was it gut-wrenching. The intense, emotional journey of Holly and Sy was nearly perfect.
