This is hard to read at all - the narrative jumps around in time and place a LOT, more so at the beginning. Then the viewpoint shifts to that of someone else entirely. There are a lot of elements in common with the Gorean novels, though we are spared the repeated several-pages-long monologs common in that series. Its not a bad story, but its not really good enough to make one in much of a hurry to get the next book in the series.

I love these books by Norman. There is plenty of his characteristically sexual themes of warriors and

conquered women and it is good to see them off Gor. Norman rarely disappoints and your collection won't be complete without the Telnarian histories. There's a new fourth book in the series out too.
