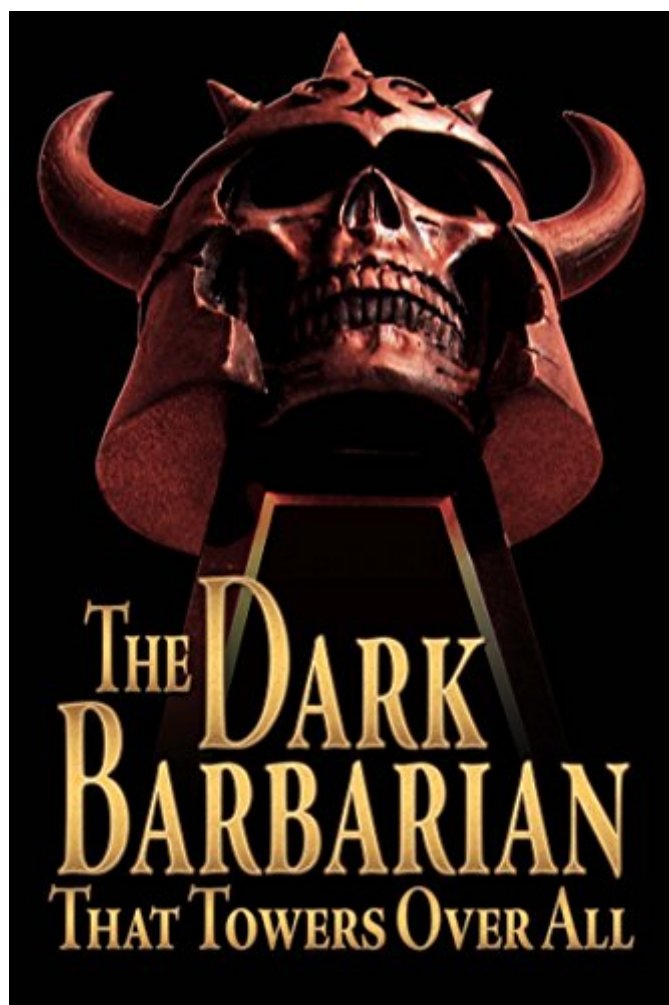

For the first time as eBooks for the first time together the landmark critical anthologies on the writings of Robert E. Howard edited by Don Herron: *The Dark Barbarian* and *The Barbaric Triumph*. Originally published in 1984 by the academic publisher Greenwood Press, *The Dark Barbarian* smashed the glass ceiling that had been keeping Howard's reputation stuck in the pulp ghetto. Tops my list of all Howard studies so far. Serious, scholarly, yet entertaining throughout. If you have a serious interest in Robert E. Howard's work and in Conan as Howard conceived him, then this book is not only a desirable addition to your library, but a necessary one. *The Savage Sword of Conan* The *Dark Barbarian* is, quite simply, the finest critical anthology I have ever read. "Conan vs. Conantics" was the first major battle in the war to secure pure Robert E. Howard texts and only Howard for collections of his work. A war that Howard scholars and fans ultimately won. Hippos also includes "The Shadow of the Dragon," exploring how no less than martial arts icon Bruce Lee was subjected to much the same sort of posthumous collaboration action as Howard, plus essays on Karl Edward Wagner, Richard L. Tierney and more. And in addition to all the essays found in *The Dark Barbarian* and *The Barbaric Triumph*, you'll find a horde of MegaPack Extras: "Swords at the Academy Gates" the cornerstone essay for the launch of the Howardian journal *The Dark Man* in 1990. "Conan the Expensive" cornerstone essay for the launch of *The Cimmerian* in 2004. "On Howardian Fairyland" a fan favorite the best one-page litcrit statement on Robert E. Howard ever done. And much more. In one package, the greatest litcrit on Howard yet written as well as the complete history of

literary criticism on the author of *Red Nails* and *Beyond the Black River*. Professor Paul Shovlin once noted that "With Howard, we are working with a figure whose writing has galvanized those outside the realm of Academy to pursue critical analysis in a pro-agentative way that reclaims the purpose and role of scholarship democratically." Indeed, Howard critics ripped the bloody crown away from hesitant scribes holed up in the Ivory Tower, and gave the author who brought us Conan, Kull, Solomon Kane and more the thunderous coverage his work deserves. And the best of the best lairs here in *The Dark Barbarian That Towers Over All!*

I graduated to reading Robert E. Howard's fiction in the mid-1960s, after leaving Burroughs and Heinlein and a host of similar popular writers behind. Strictly speaking, this first encounter was the hybrid-novel *Almuric*, but the real fun began when I discovered Conan the Adventurer, especially "The People of the Black Circle." I'll never put Howard in the rear-view, whose better stories I simply relish rereading. Howard is a writer who sparks serious interest. Even I felt compelled to participate during the days of the trend-setting Cimmerian journal, where in more than one issue I lauded

August Derleth's decision to publish the first American hardcover editions of Howard's fiction and verse following the unconscionable decade-plus of neglect. Hence I was in the thick of things when Don Herron--contributor and editor of *The Dark Barbarian That Towers Over All*--issued his second anthology of essays about Howard: *The Barbaric Triumph*. The first was *The Dark Barbarian*, and I couldn't go back to secure my copy fast enough. The two, along with the Cimmerian reporting any new developments back then, provided all one needed to know about this important American author. Today *The Dark Barbarian That Towers* bundles both of these Herron-edited anthologies, all of the expert contributors (Leiber, Eng, Hoffman, to name a few, as well as the illusive George Knight) with all of those important essays written about ol' Two-Gun. Even Steve Tompkins, who Herron touts "one of the deepest litcrit of litcrit guys" is present. (I will add here how a print or MegaPack collection of Tompkins is way overdue.) In addition there is the wealth of up-to-date "bonus" material (equivalent to a third book) by Herron himself to round out and complete this essential history of Robert E.
