

The son lyrically imagines his fatherâ ™s return to a bay in Puerto Rico: â œMay the water glow blue as a hyacinth in your hands.â • Other poems confront collective grief in the wake of the killings at the Sandy Hook Elementary School and police violence against people of color: â œHeal the Cracks in the Bell of the Worldâ • urges us to â œmelt the bullets into bells.â • Yet the poet also revels in the absurd, recalling his dubious career as a Shakespearean â œactor,â • finding madness and tenderness in the crowd at Fenway Park. In exquisitely wrought images, Espadaâ ™s poems show us the faces of Whitmanã ™s â œnumberless unknown heroes.â •
